The Swinerton Foundation was founded in 2002 to honor our obligation to be a committed corporate citizen. As a company and as a corporate family, we believe it is our duty to better the communities in which we live, work, and build. In our thirteenth full year of operations, we reached a total funding of \$987,430 this year from the Swinerton company and various fundraising events. The Foundation has been certified by the Internal Revenue Service and the State of *California as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. The value of that* status is that the Foundation can receive and make tax-deductible contributions. Those contributions benefit non-profit organizations that support youth, health, human services, and culture and the arts. The Foundation adopted a philosophy, that we have a responsibility to help those in need and to support our employees to do the same. We believe this philosophy mirrors the attitude of our employees and properly reflects the "soul" of our company.

FUNDRAISING

Each year, the Foundation holds fundraisers that provide us with the additional funding we need to support nonprofit organizations, local communities, and its members. Combined, our fundraisers in 2015 brought in \$348,175.

FALL GIVING

The Fall Giving Challenge is a friendly competition among our divisions right before the start of the holiday season. It's one of the most exciting times of the year for us-engaging employees to volunteer at local shelters, donate reusable items, and support organizations that work to provide essential support to those in need. This year, Swinerton employees raised over \$88,000, donated over 36,000 goods, and volunteered over 2,100 hours of their time.

UNIVERSITY GIVING

The Swinerton Foundation supports educational programs preparing students for successful and rewarding careers within the construction industry as part of our University Giving program. In 2015, the Foundation supported 21 universities throughout California, Washington, Hawaii, Texas, Kansas, Colorado, Oregon, and Idaho.

Working with Rebuilding Together, Swinerton Builders Portland provided home improvements and enhanced the living conditions of a very deserving homeowner. With an age of more than 100 years, the Sears Catalog-looking home was heavily overgrown with thick vegetation, the exterior paint had not been redone in decades, and various items collected over the years reached the basement ceiling. The team was tasked to remove the shrubbery, repaint the exterior, and clear a pathway in the basement to allow the City of Portland to make plumbing repairs.

On prep day, the team removed the majority of the vegetation and pressure washed the exterior of the home. On the big day, they put the vegetation in a drop box, scraped the exterior of the house to remove flaking paint, and cleared a path in the basement. Several other improvements were made including a custom doorframe and a new front door to provide the homeowner with necessary security the house was previously lacking. The power company was called in to fix a power line that was pulling off the home's wood siding; they also assisted with painting the roof eave from their bucket lift. Inches of dirt was removed to make the sidewalk usable, flower beds were reworked, shallow spots were filled in, and an enormous helping of new bark dust was poured by the crew. The painting crew successfully removed flaking paint, and with the help of one of our painting subcontractors, added a fresh coat of primer.



Headquartered in Seattle, the organization has a statewide presence with youth chapters in Spokane, Yakima, Everett, Tacoma, and Olympia. Their youth programs train young people who have been homeless or in foster care to be their own best advocates. By doing so, they change policies and perceptions that stand in the way of every child having a safe and stable home. Additionally, their family programs advocate for innovation in the way services, such as foster care, are delivered. By creating supportive systems of care, youth thrive while developing lasting connections to support their successful transition to adulthood.

Swinerton Senior Project Manager Robert Hatheway's daughter, Erin, is an outreach coordinator at Mockingbird. That's how Robert found out firsthand the important assistance and mentorship they provide to youth in need. HEROES IN ACTION

On April 25, the 7.8 magnitude Gorkha earthquake struck Nepal, displacing 2.5 million people from their homes and sadly injuring and killing thousands. In June, Silicon Valley Operations Manager Tom Malloy joined an international team of dedicated volunteers from Nepal and around the globe, to help rebuild damaged facilities and provide relief efforts to those affected by the catastrophe. The initial team made up of search & rescue and medical teams from the U.S., Mexico, and Canada, arrived in Nepal within three days of the first earthquake; saving countless lives while helping distribute emergency food, water, and generators. The follow-up team was charged with food distribution, organizing local Nepalese volunteers, and building temporary schools in the damaged areas around Kathmandu.

During their time in the country, Tom and a Nepalese Construction Engineer heading up the team's efforts met with the organization Room to Read (R2R) at their Nepal headquarters. With the assistance of Swinerton, Tom was able to donate one month of volunteer hours to help rebuild Nepal and create an organization which plans to continue rebuilding efforts for the next several years.

In addition to Tom's efforts, Swinerton employees from across the company raised money for victims of the Nepal earthquake. The Swinerton Foundation matched these contributions, sending a total of \$9,820 to UNICEF, the American Red Cross, and Save the Children.
